Prof. KRISTIAN KRISTIANSEN was born in Denmark 1948 and is now professor of Archaeology at Gothenburg University, Sweden. He was the first researcher to explain the Bronze Age as a historical epoch of globalization, from Mesopotamia to Scandinavia. He presented his ideas on this topic in two influential books: Europe before History (1998), and with Thomas Larsson: The Rise of Bronze Age Society (2005). Recently, he concluded major field projects in Sicily, Hungary and Denmark/Sweden. Prof. Kristiansen's research focuses on the Bronze Age, the role of archaeological heritage and archaeological theory in an extraordinary way. He initiated the establishment and became the first president of the European Association of Archaeologists (1994-98), and in 2005 he received the European Archaeological Heritage Prize.
